"Animal Life" by Alfred Brehm is a zoological reference work that was founded by non-fiction author Alfred Brehm and has made a significant contribution to the popularization of knowledge since the 19th century. The author of this original drawing is Friedrich Specht (May 6, 1839, Lauffen am Neckar - June 12, 1909, Stuttgart), the author of this 6 drawing, Friedrich Specht (1839 Lauffen am Nektar - 1909 Stuttgart) was a German painter and natural history illustrator. He held his first exhibition at the Stuttgart Art Academy. He provided illustrations of animals and landscapes for a large number of zoology and veterinary science publications, notably for the first edition of Brehms Tierleben (1864-69) designed by Alfred Edmund Brehm, Brockhaus and Efron Encyclopedic Dictionary (1890 -1907),

His brothers were the wood engraver Carl Gottlob Specht and the animal painter August Specht (1849-1923). He was responsible for the lion's head on Adolf Gnauth's [de] memorial to the fallen warriors of Stuttgart.
