After 1968, the return to painting involving the hand generates periods or series of canvases. The year 1974 is characterized by the use of industrial tools. Next comes the series of "Insects", then the model of European Baroque architecture, of which he retains only the details. In 1976, he became a professor at the School of Fine Arts in Rouen.
