Small Asian Cabinet, in solid light walnut, attributed to Gabriel Viardot (1830-1906). A French wood carver and student of Jeanselme, Viardot is renowned and renowned for his avant-garde work in the production of Asian furniture. This piece of furniture, made up of niches, opens with a drawer in a strip, slightly shaped and with a knockout, with chiseled patterns on the front and on the returns. This drawer has a gilt bronze elephant head handle. The top, whose extremities are reversed in the pagoda style, presents a removable altar with ornamental bronze representing a dragon. The central part has a door mounted on brass knobs with original functional lock. This door, with a molded frame, is dark with a recessed panel inlaid with bone and mother-of-pearl motifs
