AM AIR MINISTRY "Air Ministry" was the former British government ministry responsible for managing the affairs of the Royal Air Force (RAF)

The P8 was commonly used from around 1937 on Spitfire, Hurricane, Tiger Moth, etc...

It was replaced by the P11. There was also a version called P8 M where the suffix M means modified: replacement of the reticle with a four-wire device.

The compass body sits in a vibrating mount and the compass ring is movable to indicate heading.
