This horseman, also known as the Kotoko Horseman, refers to a magical force in the Sao culture. The horse represents the unwell, while the man on the mount, who usually has no distinct features, refers to the evil spirit. The Putchu guinadji, literally translated as "horses of madness", had the ability to ward off madness or dementia from the individual who wore this figurine as an amulet. Its small size meant that it could be carried everywhere by its owner, sometimes for several years.
