Dimensions: 46.5 x 32 cm Notes: Georges Bigot is one of the rare French people to fully establish themselves in Japan at the end of the 19th century, for 17 years. He wears a kimono, speaks Japanese, marries a Japanese woman with whom he has a child and edits a satirical newspaper Tôbaé. Little known in his native country, it is truly in Japan that he passes into posterity1. The work of Georges Ferdinand Bigot is today one of the most precious testimonies to understanding customs in the Meiji era.
