complete his training at the Beaux-Arts in Paris (1948-1952). After a ceramics internship at the Manufacture de Sèvres in 1950, he created his own ceramics workshop in Paris in 1952 with Denise. They work together as a complementary couple: Peter creates the shapes and Denise decorates the pieces in a modern and abstract expression. At the start of production, Peter created some abstract decorations that were more geometric and sharp than those of Denise. The ceramic pieces were signed: Peter Orlando, sometimes Denise Orlando, Orlando or Orla.
