He exhibited regularly in Paris in the 1920s and 1930s, during the golden age of the Art Deco movement. He liked to work with a wide range of materials: stone, bronze, cast iron,

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114 Avenue Michelet Saint-Ouen 93400 marble or even terracotta. His sculptures are often in motion, he produced mostly on a living model. The style of the Faguays is close to Demeter Chiparus, known mainly for his bronze and ivory sculptures depicting exotic dancers. The artist used the names «Guerbe» or «Raymonde Guerbe» to sign some of his works. Most of them come from the famous foundry of Max le Verrier. After the war, the artist tried his hand at drawing and painting. He died on 8 September 1962 in Paris.
