Observe the freshness of the colors, the delicacy and grace of the movements of the virgin revealing her sleeping son to the viewer, the devotion of her face.

The composition also presents Saint Joseph in the background, looking at a young girl who has surely come to admire the child who has just been born. In the foreground, Saint John the Baptist accompanied by his lamb representing the future martyr of Christ.

He holds out a cross towards the mother who only has eyes for the newborn.

Then without a patron and a Calvinist, he returned to Paris around 1637 and finally enjoyed great success. In 1643 the corporation of goldsmiths commissioned him for a votive painting intended to be offered to the chapter of Notre-Dame. We find of him at Loure, notably
