Entirely hand-shaped in wrought iron, exceptional mastery armor demonstrating the know-how of the French smith craftsman.

Armor, known as the harness, of which all the pieces are forged: armet, gorgerin, plastron, spalières, cubitières, gantelets, poacher, flancart, cuissots, knee pads, beaches and solerets.

The harness is the best known armor of those of the knights, due to its technical performance, it remains in use from the 13th century to the 17th century and was the last medieval armor used.

The harness is the knight's armor par excellence. Technically the most efficient of knight's armor, the harness corresponds to what the figure of the
