Free golden frame, dimensions with frame: 82 x 98 cm Sold with invoice and certificate of authenticity. Gaston Sébire (1920-2001) Painter born August 18, 1920 in Saint-Samson in Calvados. Died in 2001. He was appointed Official Painter of the Navy in 1973. From 1936 to 1944 after his studies, Gaston Sébire worked at night at the Rouen posts in order to devote himself to painting during the day. After settling in Paris in 1951, while remaining faithful to his Normandy, Gaston Sébire created the costumes and sets for Cuevas' "The Gray Angel" in 1953. From the sixties, he regularly participated in group exhibitions: the

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Salon des Indépendant; the Salon d'Automne; the Comparisons Salon; the Salon of French Artists, Salon d'Angers. He also participated in the various exhibitions of the School of Paris at the Galerie Charpentier in Paris between 1953 and 1961. In 1957 Gaston Sébire returned to Normandy, where he settled with his family. From 1965 he exhibited at Wally Findlay Galleries in New York, Paris, and Chicago. Winner of the Critics' Prize in 1953, the Greenshields Prize in 1957, he won the Gold Medal from the Salon des Artistes Français in 1968. In 1991 the Musée de la Marine paid tribute to Gaston Sébire throughout the summer. Museums: Paris: Museum of Modern Art of the city of Paris. Rouen: Museum of Fine Arts.
