JAPANESE VASE FROM THE SECOND HALF OF THE 19TH CENTURY WITH A COMPOSITION OF CLOISONNÉ ENAMELS IN STYLISH FLOWER COLORS ON A BLUE BACKGROUND, THIS TECHNIQUE OF APPLYING CLOISONNÉ ENAMELS ON A JAPANESE PORCELAIN BASE IS CALLED "TOKAI SHIPPO OR SOMETIMES JIKI SHIPPO" CLOISONNÉ ARTIST ESTABLISHED IN NAGOYA TSUKAMOTO KAISUKE 1828-1887 IS GENERALLY CREDITED WITH THE DISCOVERY OF THE APPLICATION OF CLOISONNÉ ENAMELS ON A PORCELAIN OR CERAMIC BASE CIRCA 1868 THE MARKS APPLIED IN RED ON THE
