Baccarat) was made possible by a favourable economic climate and a supply of excellent quality raw crystal, as evidenced by certain exchanges with the Vonêche manufactory.

In the space of two decades, production capacity became absolutely enormous, and the objects produced became even more diversified.

In addition, the European fashion for neoclassicism was evident in the mass distribution of copies of antique cameos, which were initially presented framed and were very popular.

Saint Amand was responsible for the first attempts to include biscuit cameos in crystal. This know-how was twofold, since it involved mastering cameo sculpture as well as mastering the composition of biscuit dough and its firing. It takes around ten years to produce successful pieces. Most of these pieces bear the effigies of influential contemporary figures: the Emperor, his wife, Louis XVIII, the Comte d'Artois, the Duc de Berry and his wife, and the Duchesse d'Angoulême.
