The base bears a Samson style mark, commonly used on replicas of German porcelain, and features the letter "R" on the back of the pedestal. The Samson Porcelain Factory, founded by Edmé Samson in Paris in 1845, was known for its high-quality reproductions of historical and museum-quality ceramics. Samson's express intention was to make high-quality reproductions of ceramics displayed in museums and private collections. The factory specialized in creating faithful replicas of famous porcelain styles from Meissen, Chantilly, Chelsea, Derby, and even Chinese porcelain. Samson's reproductions were so well made that they were often mistaken for the originals, although the factory took care to clearly mark their pieces to avoid deception. Samson & Co. worked primarily with hard porcelain, as opposed to the soft porcelain often used for the originals they imitated. They often produced works in different sizes or colors to differentiate them from the originals. Although they are replicas, Samson pieces have become highly sought-after collectors' items, prized for their finely painted details and carefully modeled figures. But at a certain stage of development, Samson copies became more valuable than the originals. Samson porcelain has gained a reputation for its finely painted and carefully modeled porcelain figures that it retains today for collectors.
