This beautiful terracotta jar is a fine example of traditional Provençal craftsmanship, probably originating from Biot, a village renowned for its pottery and jars for several centuries. With its generous shapes and slightly flared neck, it reflects the unique know-how of the region's potters, who combined utility and aesthetics. Characteristics: o Material: Natural terracotta with an aged patina that testifies to its authenticity and history. o Shape: Curved body and narrow base, typical of Provençal jars, originally designed for storing goods such as olive oil, wine or grains. o Color: Warm tones of ochre and beige, typical of the local earths used in Biot. o Finish: Partial interior enameling, often applied to improve watertightness. Use: o At the time, these jars were mainly used as practical
