Anthropomorphic terracotta statuette, from the pre-Columbian period (1), in perfect condition. Representation of a character in "clothing", a mask seems to cover his face, his legs are punctuated. Residual earth inside. Origin: Mexico, 14th-15th centuries. Height: 10 cm.

Original piece, guaranteed period. Comes from a French collection of pre-Columbian objects gathered by a collector during the second half of the 20th century, sold at the very end of the 1990s.
