Julius Eduard Marák (1832 Litomysl - 1899 Smíchov) was a Czech painter, landscape painter, draughtsman and graphic artist of the second half of the 19th century. In 1882 he received a commission to decorate the National Theatre and in 1887 he moved to Prague, having been offered a position as a professor at the Prague Academy in the landscape painting workshop.[8] He headed the landscape school for twelve years. Among his students were: Antonín Slavíček, Václav Brezina,
