Pair of bronzes representing the Executioner holding the head of St. John the Baptist after a model by François Duquesnoy and an Orator (sometimes identified as Julius Caesar) after the Antique.

Beautiful casts (in one piece with the terrace) with translucent patina.

Height of the bronzes: 26.7 and 27.2 cm

Total heights: 32 and 32.5 cm

To report: the executioner's sword blade lacking. Mounted on blue turquin marble bases. Dealer
