Description

Men's dressing table in mahogany veneer. It opens with a flap revealing a mirror and a white marble shelf and 1 large wig drawer in the belt. Beautiful chased and mercury-gilded bronze trim, with amusing bronzes of cupids under a palm tree. (exoticism for a naval officer?). Parisian manufacture mounted on oak from the Directoire or Empire period, late 18th century early 19th century. The men's dressing table differs from the women's model by a single large flap revealing a mirror and generally a large marble top, while the women's model opens with 3 flaps, revealing on either side of the central mirror boxes for ointments and brushes. An elegant model, our dressing table is distinguished by an interesting mechanism with its flap mounted on a rail which allows the mirror to be moved more or less
