surface. The outer lid features elegantly robed aristocrats among pine trees and blossoms, set against a backdrop of distant mountains. Inside the lid is a tranquil riverside landscape, framed by delicate geometric gilding. At the heart of the bowl, a paradise bird appears among blooming flora and misty peaks, evoking a serene, otherworldly atmosphere.

This piece exemplifies the hallmarks of early Kutani ware--refined brushwork, balanced composition, and deep spiritual symbolism. The underside bears a signature attributed to Okuda, affirming its authenticity and artistic provenance.

The bowl's outstanding preservation--free from cracks, chips, or restorations--adds to its rarity, particularly for a work of this size and complexity.

An exceptional addition to any serious collection of Japanese art or porcelain, this piece also offers long-term investment value as Edo-period Kutani ware continues to be highly sought after.

Kutani ware, originating in 1655, is Japan's oldest porcelain tradition and is celebrated for its vivid colours, symbolic imagery, and elaborate painting techniques. Early Kutani pieces from the Edo period are particularly treasured for their artistic merit and cultural significance. The works of master artists such as Okuda are considered the pinnacle of this tradition.
