Mughal Empire, India, early 19th century Iron, steel, gold damascene Total length: 36.3 cm (without scabbard) - Blade length: 20.9 cm Steel blade, damascus, with double cutting edges, median ridges and double recessed gutters. Pierced mesh tip. The forge is integral, leading to a U-shaped handle composed of a double damascus branch, convex on the outside, and linked by two crossbars.
