Description

Pierre-Adrien Dalpayrat (1844-1910) & Jean Coulon (1853-1923) - "La Nuit" This spectacular enameled stoneware pitcher is a masterful blend of sculpture and ceramics, showcasing the remarkable craftsmanship of Pierre-Adrien Dalpayrat and Jean Coulon. The main volume is shaped like an eagle owl, its chest sheltering three sleeping female figures, while a fourth is nestled at the base, curled between its talons. The green glaze, marbled with gray on a light background, enhances the dreamlike quality of the piece, accentuating the fluidity of its forms. Signed with the "exploded pomegranate" stamp, this rare and iconic Art Nouveau creation stands as a testament to its era's artistic excellence.
