He was a pupil of Léon Brunel. Member of the Société des Artistes Français, he has taken part in exhibitions since 1879.Brunel de Neuville is the painter of still lifes; he exalts the velvety, the precision of the feathers, hairs etc... by contrasting them with

He exhibited at the Salon from 1879, small canvases depicting games of cats and kittens, then very popular with amateurs. In 1909 he exhibited in Nîmes Young Cats and Peaches and Grapes "Eleventh exhibition in Nîmes, 1909. He then lived at 35, rue de Meudon in Billancourt.
