Description

The 2 portraits of Ignace de Loyola and François-Xavier, in painted enamel, Limoges. The two founders of the Compagnie of Jesus with the first Companions in 1539. The 2 friends: François-Xavier (1506-1552) and Ignatius Loyola (1491-1556), Spanish Basque, both canonized the same day of 1622. The counter-enamelling is midnight blue and one of the portraits bears the signature in gold. These 2 portraits on slightly curved plates form a pair, of the same dimensions and that I wish not separate. Limoges, end of 17th century for the greater glory of God, written on the book of Saint Ignatius.
