

Christ In Bonds, Carved Monoxylous Wood, 17th Century



Description

A magnificent 17th-century monoxylous wood sculpture depicting Christ in Bonds, also known as Christ of Pity. This artwork captures a poignant moment in the Passion of Christ, when He awaits His suffering between the stations of the cross where Jesus is stripped of His garments and given gall to drink. The expression of suffering and resignation is finely rendered, reflecting the emotional depth and devotional artistry of the period.

The piece retains numerous traces of its original polychromy, showcasing the skill and devotion of the artisans of the time. The monoxylous wood, carved from a single block, demonstrates the technical mastery of the 17th-century sculptors who could convey powerful religious scenes with
