Nicolas Collier was born in Versailles in 1733. Backed by the great cuillériste Nicolas Martin Langlois, he was accepted as a master in 1766. Nicolas Collier became a specialist in "simple and robust" cutlery [Nocq] under the sign "With the arms of Condé", rue Dauphine, where the tables mention it until 1793.

Regulatory marks for Paris, from October 1, 1768 to November 18, 1774, Régie de Julien Alaterre

- Poinçon de charge for large works silver (A crowned and flowered A) [Bimbenet-Privat n ° 465, p.144 & Dennis II n ° 102c, p.53];
- Discharge mark for gold & small pieces of silver (helmeted head in profile looking to the right) [Bimbenet-Privat n $^{\circ}$ 468, p.144 & Dennis II n $^{\circ}$ 102e, p.53];
- Hallmark of jurande insculpé from July 12,
 1769 to July 16, 1770 (crowned F)
 [Bimbenet-Privat n° 480, p.145 & Dennis II n°
 102b, p.53]

Posterior hallmark

- Weevil hallmark, inscribed from 1864 to 1893 on gold and silver articles imported from countries bound by trade treaties with France [Beuque I p.88 No. 781]. This hallmark, which guaranteed the minimum legal title [800/1000], bears here as different the capital P of the Pontarlier (Doubs) Guarantee Office, created on March 29, 1865 [Beuque I p.283 n ° 2504].

Coat of arms

In an oval shield (traditionally called lady's shield) and foliage, surmounted by a count's crown:

Gules, with the golden cross

These arms can refer to the House of Allinges,
originally from Chablais.

Alain Gruber

Alain Gruber was born in Delémont in 1943 and

died in Friborg in 2020. This great traveler with a multifaceted career was curator of silverware at the Swiss National Museum, director of the Abegg Foundation in Riggisberg (BE), university teacher in Friborg and New York, cultural manager at Christie's Geneva, London and New York. His exceptional knowledge of the decorative arts led him to prestigious missions such as the redevelopment of the Rothschild family mansion in Waddesdon near London [online notice on the Canton of Jura website]. Its very large working library devoted to decorative arts was donated to the Jura cantonal library.
