Inspiration from Iznik pottery from the XV - XVII centuries, pottery which was used to eat and serve food and functions related to religious worship. Around 1560 - 1600, it is the culmination of production with a rich repertoire of naturalistic motifs. It is the height of the Ottoman Empire. We then find colors turquoise, green, emerald, black, dark red with black outlines. In the 19th century, there is a tendency to collect Islamic works of art which become a real source of inspiration for Europeans. Thus,
