Description

The sunset landscape of Elba Island in Tuscany (place of exile of the French Emperor Napoleon) was executed by the Italian landscape painter Guido Agostini (active between the 1850s and 1890s).

He studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Genoa, where he exhibited his paintings at the exhibitions of Firenze da Rovezzano. The following regularly participates in the exhibitions of the Promotrici di Academia Society in Florence and Genoa. by A. are about 35 with the sign "G. Agostini". and partly dat. According to (oil on cardboard, wood or slate, sometimes oval) on the art market and in Priv.-Collections with Landscapes of Late Romanticism and Vedute of Tuscany (Val d'elsa, Valdarno, Chianti, Maremma) with farmhouses individual or forts (Castello di Verruca, 1874)
