## Description

Florentine school, 17th century San Giovanni Battista

Oil on canvas, diam. cm 20 - with frame diam. 30 In this small round-format canvas, Saint John the Baptist is represented in half-bust with his typical childish iconography, dressed in poor clothes made of dear skin and a scarlet cloak. The Young looks at us, showing the stick on which is tied the cartouche with the traditional inscription: "Ecce Agnus Dei", the phrase pronounced when he saw Jesus for the first time. The iconography of the Young John the Baptist in the desert, often accompanied by a Lamb, was born in the post-Tridentine period deriving from the invention of the artists of the Italian Renaissance of the episode of Saint John and the child Jesus playing together. The gesture of the outstretched
