In 1907, he was a pupil of Jean-Paul Laurens, attended the Academy "la Palette in Montparnasse", met Luc-Albert Moreau and Boussignault with whom he shared a studio. Roughly indifferent to contemporary aesthetic revolutions, he undertook, with Boussignault and Moreau, to resuscitate the realism of Courbet by executing still lifes, nudes, landscapes, in a thick paste and From this period,

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renting a house belonging to Signac, he discovers the landscapes of Saint-Tropez, to which he will remain faithful and where he lived until the end of his life. In the summer, for the rest, at the contrary, he led a real nomadic life, in search of the motif especially through the Îles de France, the Valley of Grand Morin, Feucherolles, Chennevières, etc. In 1910, he met the fashion designer Paul Poiret and met Max Jacob, Dufy, Vlaminck. From 1910 to 1914, he traveled to Italy, Spain, North Africa, he was interested in sport and dance (drawings from Isadora Duncan's Russian Ballet, 1911, The Boxers 1910). From 1914 to 1918, mobilized in the infantry he made the war hard, before being assigned to the camouflage. He executed many war drawings, valuable for their artistic and documentary value. From 1919 he appeared again in numerous exhibitions, including the main Parisian salons. He appears at the beginning of the post-war period as the main representative of Traditional Realism. In 1921, he met Valéry, Léon-Paul Farges, Jean Cocteau. In 1928, he made a trip to America where he met with great success. In 1930, he befriends Derain. In 1933, Prize of the Carnegie foundation of Pittsburgh. In 1934, Prize of the Venice Biennale. In 1938, he exhibits in Chicago. In 1939, he exhibits in London at the Wildenstein gallery; in 1947, he was elected member of the Royal Academy of London. In 1948, he was elected associate member of the Royal Academy of Belgium. Exhibition at the Galerie Charpentier Paris followed by another in Basel. In 1951, exhibition at the Museum of Art and History in Geneva. In 1959, exhibition at the Royal Academy of London. In 1972, Galerie Durand-Ruel Paris. After his death began the posthumous retrospectives. In 1975, Musée de l'Athénée in Geneva. In 1976, Retrospective, at the Orangerie de Tuileries in Paris.
