Born in Belgium in 1923 Guy Cambier has been living in Monaco for several years where, through his talent, he has become the friend of many celebrities from the political and cultural world. Rembrandt was and has remained his idol, since the day he discovered him in Brussels, during a retrospective given at the Palais des Beaux-Arts.

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The genius of Amsterdam would henceforth be his God. Only the love of painting and the masters of the Renaissance will teach him to understand the technique of painting. At nineteen, he offered an exhibition to visitors of Belgian Art; and already appears, sensitive and orderly, his taste for the finished work, elaborated in an atmosphere of work and research. When he left his country for Monaco, he quickly found an audience among genuine amateurs for whom figurative art was not yet a shameful evil. From then on begins a brilliant period during which Cambier continues to collect prizes and awards: Young Painting (1956) Participation in the Biennale of Menton (1958), numerous exhibitions in Nice, Cannes, Paris, Lyon, Geneva, Zurich. Acquisitions are made by the French State and by several American collections in New York and San Francisco. Guy Cambier continues his conquest of an informed public, in love like himself with the masters of the Renaissance. With him, if there is admiration for a prestigious pictorial past, there is no question of continuing to do "Rembrandt, Goya, Vermeer", quite the contrary. Taking the best from the great masters, Guy Cambier wants to continue his research and always move forward. A painting with which the dialogue is constant because it is the reflection of life itself. A painting that rehabilitates easel work, neat backgrounds, sought-after glazes, an expressive paste, a rigorous composition open to a beyond through a window, a landscape, a light. We find there the stubborn affirmation of values, today contested and more necessary than ever for the solitaries that we are becoming: love, family, nature, the beauty of faces and bodies just like that of the flower. So many aspects that make Cambier a painter against the current who does not deviate from his line: a painting that dares to affirm the need for gentleness in a century of violence and that delivers us, through the mysterious harmony of its forms and its colors, hope announcing the happiness and spirituality of the day after tomorrow.
